Each year, Colquitt EMC sponsors high school students to participate in the Washington Youth Tour. This top-notch leadership experience and tour of Washington, D.C. includes meetings with state and national leaders and leadership training, as well as visits to all the major sights. This year's Washington Youth Tour will be held June 14-21, 2024. Students who are chosen as finalists will be interviewed by a panel of judges for the final phase of the selection process. Three students will be chosen to represent Colquitt EMC on the 2024 Washington Youth Tour. Applicants must: Reside in the household of a Colquitt EMC Member, be at least 16 years old and a current high school junior or senior, hold a GPA of 2.5 or higher, and provide a copy of their transcript (official or unofficial accepted) and two letters of recommendation

WALTER HARRISON SCHOLARSHIP

Colquitt EMC participates in Georgia EMC's Walter Harrison Scholarship program. This program was created in 1985 by the Georgia Electric Membership Corporation Board of Directors to honor the late Walter Harrison, a pioneer in bringing electricity to rural areas of Georgia.

The recipients of the Walter Harrison Scholarship are based primarily on academic achievement and financial need. The scholarships, in the amount of \$1,000, may be used for undergraduate studies at any two-year or four-year accredited college or university in Georgia, including vocational schools. To be considered, students must be accepted or enrolled in an accredited undergraduate degree program, complete the application, and write a two-page autobiographical sketch with reference to future plans and goal

write a two-page autobiographical sketch with reference to future plans and goals. Colquitt EMC will only accept scholarship applications from students that reside in the home of a Colquitt EMC member or the home of a Colquitt EMC employee.

Hoppin' John Combo

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup rice
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 5 slices bacon, diced
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 1/2 cup celery
- 1 (16 ounce) can black-eyed peas, drained
- 1/4 cup barbecue sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon Tabasco sauce more or less to taste
- 2 2 cups of cooked chicken or smoked sausage (or 1 cup of each)

DIRECTIONS

Cook rice according to directions, substituting the chicken broth for the water content. In a large saucepan, fry bacon, then add the onions and celery, cooking them until they are clear. Stir in the rice, black-eyed peas, barbecue sauce, Tabasco, meat and season with salt and pepper. Serve this dish immediately.
