- Unplug electronics when you're not using them. Even when turned off, many electronics continue to use power. Santa makes sure to unplug all of his


electronics when he's not using them, including his computer, TV, and phone charger.

Bagel French Toast Casserole

INGREDIENTS

- 2 Bagels Plain, Raisin or Blueberry are best.
- 3 Ounces Laughing Cow Cheese (3 wedges)
- 3 Eggs
- ½ Cup Milk
- ½ Teaspoon Vanilla
- 2 Tablespoons Maple Syrup
- 1/4 Cup Chopped Pecans
- Cinnamon Sugar

DIRECTIONS

Cut the bagels in half and spread evenly with the Laughing Cow Cheese. Cut each half into eights and place cut side down in an 8x8 pan that has been sprayed with non-stick cooking spray. In a small bowl, mix the eggs, vanilla, and maple syrup; pour over bagels and sprinkle with chopped pecans. Cover the dish with foil, place in a refrigerator overnight. The next morning, remove from refrigerator 30 minutes prior to baking and allow to stand on counter. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and place covered dish in oven. Cook for 30 minutes, uncover, sprinkle liberally with cinnamon sugar and bake an additional 20-30 minutes or until center is firm and surface is lightly brown. Serve with warmed maple syrup.
