

Electric Heat Pump water heaters can dramatically reduce your energy consumption and now the State of Georgia is providing rebates to help qualified citizens install a new heat pump water heater at half or no cost.

The Home Electrification and Appliance Rebates (HEAR) program will help low-and-moderate income households secure savings on new heat pump water heater purchases.

To participate, households will need to show proof of purchase, installation, income documentation, and adhere to all program requirements.

To qualify for an electrification and appliance rebate (i.e., HEAR program), your project must meet certain criteria, established by U.S. Department of Energy. These standards are commonly known as "qualified electrification projects" (QEP) which ensure all equipment types meet program requirements needed to qualify for a rebate.

The purchase and installation of an electric heat pump water heater is eligible for rebate when the purchase is a first-time purchase of a heat pump water heater (e.g., when upgrading an electric resistance or gas storage water heater).

Electric tank water heaters are eligible for rebates if upgrading to a heat pump water heater. This is an income-based program where incentive amounts are tied to your household's Area Median Income (AMI) level. For example, the 80% Area Median income for a family of 4 in the Colquitt EMC service area is \$56,400. A family of 4 with an income of less than \$56,400 may be eligible to receive a rebate of up to 100% of the total project cost with an incentive limit (not to exceed) \$1,750 for a heat pump water heater.

The 150% Area Median Income of a family of four in the Colquitt EMC service area is \$105,750. A family making between \$56,400 and \$105,749 may be eligible to receive a rebate of up to 50% of the total project cost with an incentive limit (not to exceed) \$1,750 for a heat pump water heater.

Bright Ideas Grant Applications are available at colquittemc.com June 1-August 1. Bright Ideas awards teachers money for innovative lessons and projects to energize student learning. The Bright Ideas Program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to winning teachers. Public and private school teachers teaching grades K-12 in any subject area are eligible to apply. Schools in the areas that Colquitt EMC serves may submit more than one application. However, teachers are eligible to submit only one application per school year. The grants are not for professional development. The deadline for Bright Ideas Grant Applications is August 1.
