As the weather starts to cool down, it's time to make sure your heat pump is ready to keep your home warm and comfortable. A little preparation now can save you money, prevent breakdowns, and help your system run more efficiently all winter long. Here are some simple steps you can take to get your heat pump ready for heating season.

#### Check and Change the Air Filter

- Dirty filters make your heat pump run longer.
- Change the filter every 1–3 months, depending on how dusty your home is.
- A clean filter helps with airflow and keeps your indoor air cleaner.

#### Clear Around the Outdoor Unit

- Remove leaves, sticks, and dirt from around the outside unit.
- Make sure there's at least 2 feet of space around it for good airflow.
- Don't cover the unit—it needs to move air freely!

### Inspect the Thermostat

- Make sure your thermostat is working properly.
- Set it to "heat" mode and test the temperature setting.
- If it's not responding or seems off, you may need to replace the batteries or call a technician.

#### Check for Strange Noises or Smells

- Turn on your heat pump and listen for any banging, grinding, or squealing sounds.
- If you smell something burning or musty, it could be a sign of a problem.

• These issues should be checked by a professional.

#### ✓ Clean the Vents and Registers

- Dust and vacuum all the vents in your home.
- Make sure furniture or rugs aren't blocking them.
- Good airflow helps your system work better and keeps your home evenly heated.

#### Schedule a Professional Tune-Up

- A technician can check refrigerant levels, electrical connections, and overall system health.
- They'll clean the coils and make sure everything is running safely.
- It's best to do this once a year before the heating season starts.

#### Review Your Energy Bills

- Compare your current bill to last year's.
- A big increase could mean your system isn't running efficiently.
- Catching problems early can save you money.

## Know When to Call for Help

- If your heat pump isn't heating well, turns off too often, or runs constantly, it's time to call a technician.
- Don't wait until it breaks down on a cold night!

Getting your heat pump ready for heating season doesn't take long, but it makes a big difference. These simple steps will help your system run smoothly, keep your home warm, and avoid costly repairs. If you're ever unsure, it's always a good idea to call a professional for help.

#### **Pumpkin Cheesecake Bars**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1 cup all-purpose flour 1/2 cup light brown sugar, packed

5 tablespoons butter, softened

1/2 cup finely chopped pecans or 1/2 cup walnuts

1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened

3/4 cup white sugar

1/2 cup pumpkin, packed 2 large eggs, lightly beaten

1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon ground allspice

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Combine flour and brown sugar in medium bowl. Cut in butter to make a crumb mixture. Stir in nuts. Set aside 3/4 cup crumb mixture for topping. Press remaining mixture into bottom of 8x8 baking pan. Bake in preheated 350° oven for 15 minutes. Cool slightly. Combine cream cheese, sugar, pumpkin, eggs, spices and vanilla in large mixing bowl. Blend until smooth. Pour over baked crust. Sprinkle with reserved topping. Bake an additional 30-35 minutes. Cool before cutting into bars.
